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# EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

This report surveyed 150+ B2B SaaS companies (\$1M–\$500M ARR) in June 2026 on how they govern autonomous AI systems in revenue operations. The headline finding is stark: nearly half are operating agentic AI with no documented governance at all.

The companies winning with agentic AI aren't the ones deploying fastest. They're the ones with the strongest governance architecture.

## THE KEY TAKEAWAY

Companies with operationalized governance — mapped to NIST / ISO frameworks — report measurably better outcomes:

# GOVERNANCE MATURITY TIERS

Every surveyed company maps to one of four tiers, defined by how governance is documented, enforced, and embedded — and what that produces in error rate, audit readiness and revenue.

## TIER 1 — AD-HOC

22% of companies

RISK: HIGH

### CHARACTERISTICS

- Agents running in production with minimal oversight
- "Governance" = manual spot-checks by the ops team
- No documented decision framework
- Audit trail nonexistent or fragmented

**Profile:** Early-stage, pre-Series C, founder-led operations. No clear accountability when something breaks; one failure can trigger shutdown of the whole system.

*"We deployed agents and... they work? Sometimes. We're not really tracking what they do. If something breaks, we just turn it off and move on."*

## TIER 2 — DOCUMENTED

38% of companies

RISK: MEDIUM

### CHARACTERISTICS

- Governance framework written down (usually in a doc)
- Basic audit logging — who did what, when
- Decision tiers defined: autonomous vs. approval-required
- Audit trail complete, but not easily queryable

**Profile:** Series A/B, growth-focused. Rules exist but aren't always enforced; defensible retrospectively, but processes aren't automated.

*"We have policies documented. We log everything. But if an auditor asked us to prove compliance, we'd have to do a lot of manual digging through logs."*

## TIER 3 — OPERATIONALIZED

34% of companies

RISK: LOW

### CHARACTERISTICS

- Governance framework automated and enforced
- Mapped to NIST AI RMF, ISO 42001, EU AI Act
- High-stakes decisions blocked until human approves
- Audit trail fully queryable, exportable, defensible
- Kill switches trigger automatically if error rates spike

**Profile:** Series B/C+, dedicated governance owner, ops team with ops engineering. Governance isn't optional — it's built into the system.

*"An auditor asked us about our AI governance. We gave them a 15-minute walkthrough. They asked two follow-ups. We had the answers in the logs. Done. No compliance anxiety."*

## TIER 4 — COMPOUNDING

6% of companies

RISK: VERY LOW

### CHARACTERISTICS

- Governance embedded in culture, not just systems
- Continuous loops: decisions → outcomes → retraining
- Monthly reviews with full stakeholder buy-in
- Ready for regulatory changes within weeks

*"Our agents are making decisions better than our VP Sales would. Governance isn't a constraint — it's how we compete."*

# BENCHMARK FINDINGS, BY THE NUMBERS

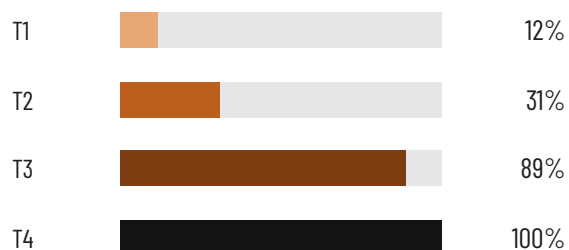

## TIME TO DEPLOY (WEEKS)



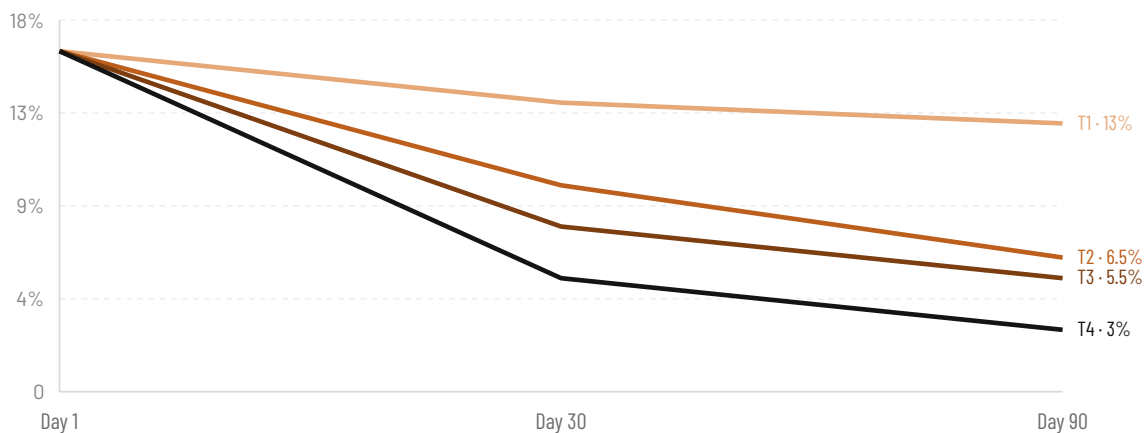
Tier 3+ take longer upfront but compress months of headache into weeks. Tier 1 companies redeploy 3–4x due to failures.

## FEEL READY FOR EXTERNAL AUDIT



Audit readiness is the sharpest divide in the dataset — it jumps from 31% to 89% at the Tier 2 → Tier 3 boundary.

## ERROR-RATE TRAJECTORY — FIRST 90 DAYS



All tiers start near 16–18%. Tier 3+ benefit from closed feedback loops and keep falling; Tier 1 plateaus because failures aren't systematically learned from.

REVENUE IMPACT – 12-MONTH WINDOW (RANGE, 0-40%)



Revenue impact scales with governance maturity — not deployment speed. Tier 4's compounding loops roughly 8x the return of Tier 1.

# THE HIGH-PERFORMER PROFILE

Five things Tier 3 & 4 companies do differently — each paired with the action that closes the gap.

## 01 Executive Alignment on AI Risk

**94%** of Tier 3+ companies have CEO/CFO explicitly signed off on the AI risk profile — versus just **18%** of Tier 1.

**ACTION** → Get CFO + CEO in a room: here's how we govern AI, here's the risk, here's the upside.

## 02 A Dedicated Governance Owner

Tier 3+ companies have one person owning governance. In Tier 1–2, governance is "someone's job in addition to their actual job."

**ACTION** → Assign ownership. Make operationalizing governance someone's explicit OKR.

## 03 Clear Decision Tiers

| TIER              | EXAMPLES                                | GOVERNANCE                  |
|-------------------|-----------------------------------------|-----------------------------|
| Autonomous        | Scoring leads, flagging stale deals     | Logged, asynchronous review |
| Approval-required | Changing forecast, terminating a deal   | Real-time approval gate     |
| Human-only        | Firing a rep, strategic pricing changes | No autonomy                 |

**ACTION** → Define tiers explicitly. Tier 1 companies have none — everything is "hope it works."

## 04 Monthly Governance Reviews

Tier 3+ companies run a monthly check-in on error rates, escalations, and feedback-loop quality. Tier 1 companies only review governance when something breaks.

**ACTION** → Put a recurring 60-minute governance review on the calendar this month.

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## 05

### Transparent Reasoning in Agent Decisions

Every Tier 3+ agent decision comes with a decision tree — why did it decide that? In Tier 1, the agent says "deal at risk" and nobody knows why.

**ACTION** → Require every autonomous decision to log its reasoning path.
